



\$500 SCHOLARSHIP F&B Communications is the premiere local telecommunications provider serving customers in the Bennett, Calamus, Delmar, Lowden and Wheatland telephone exchanges. The Board of Directors and employees of F&B Communications are committed to the education of local youth and believe learning is a lifelong process. F&B Communications will award one (1) \$500 scholarship to a deserving high school senior in the service area based on scholastic achievement, citizenship and school and community activities.

FRS \$2,500 AND OTHER NAMED SCHOLARSHIPS The Foundation for Rural Service (FRS), in cooperation with NTCA - The Rural Broadband Association (NTCA), seeks to sustain and enhance the quality of life in America by advancing an understanding of rural telecom issues. Through its various programs and initiatives, FRS strongly supports the continuing education of rural youth. F&B Communications is an NTCA member company. In 2019, FRS will award \$2,500 scholarships to rural high school seniors per geographic region of the NTCA membership and one to a student sponsored by an NTCA associate member. The awards will be distributed proportionate to the number of applicants received per region. FRS will fund \$2,000 of each scholarship, with F&B Communications providing an additional \$500 if a winning application is chosen from the F&B service area. The following named scholarships will also be awarded using this application form: Staurulakis Family Scholarships focussing on tudents who are majoring in math, science, engineering or medicine; TMS Scholarships; Everett Kneece Scholarship and Roger Alan Cox Memorial Scholarships.

Eligibility

Applicant must:

- Be a graduating high school senior.
- Be a United States citizen.
- Receive their service and live in a household in the F&B Communications telephone service area.
- Be accepted by an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school.
- Have at least a "C" grade point average (GPA).
- Express an interest to return to a rural community following graduation.

Immediate family members of F&B Communications, Foundation for Rural Service and/ or NTCA employees or directors are not eligible.

Application Instructions

- Type (preferred) or print all requested information.
- Complete the scholarship application in full. If any information is incomplete, the application will be rejected.
- Prepare a 300-word essay on one of the following topics:
 1. Describe your most significant accomplishment and explain why you believe it to be your most outstanding.
 2. Describe the community in which you live and indicate how it has influenced the person you are.
 3. What industry or opportunity would entice you to return to a rural community after completing your education, and why?
- The essay portion of the application is worth 35% of your total score. It is the most important section of the application; please make sure to use spell-check and grammar-check before submitting your essay.
- Have a high school teacher or guidance counselor complete the Educator's Statement. Statements must be submitted in a sealed envelope from the author.
- Submit one letter of recommendation from a local community leader other than an educator (elected officials, local business representatives, clergy, youth group leaders, etc.). Recommendation must be submitted in a sealed envelope from the author.
- Include your most recent grade transcript (all seven semesters must be represented). Transcript does not have to be an official copy.
- Do not include any photographs with your application.
- All signatures must be provided where indicated on the application.
- All materials, including recommendation letters, **must** be submitted together.

Award Procedures

F&B COMMUNICATIONS \$500 SCHOLARSHIP

- One (1) \$500 scholarship will be awarded in May 2019.
- Applications will be reviewed and a selection committee will narrow the list of candidates down to three (3) finalists. The finalists will be contacted for a face-to-face interview evaluation.
- Winner will be notified in April 2019.
- Scholarships will be awarded on a one-time basis and will not be renewable.
- Award will be paid upon proof of registration at an institute of higher education, and will be issued in September 2019 to the educational institution.
- Scholarship will be awarded without regard to race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender or disability.
- Incomplete applications will not be considered.

FRS SCHOLARSHIPS

- FRS will award scholarships per geographic region of the NTCA membership and one to a student sponsored by an NTCA associate member. The awards will be distributed proportionate to the number of applications received per each NTCA region.
- FRS will also award several named scholarships:
 - Staurulakis Family Scholarships focussing on students who are majoring in math, science, engineering or medicine.
 - TMS Scholarships.
 - Everett Kneece Scholarship.
 - Roger Alan Cox Memorial Scholarships.
- All applications will be reviewed, and winners selected, by a qualified selection committee of educators.
- Scholarships will be awarded on a one-time basis and will not be renewable.
- Awards will be paid upon proof of registration at an institute of higher education, and will be issued in August 2019.
- Scholarship will be awarded without regard to race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender or disability.
- Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- Winners will forfeit scholarship if mandatory paperwork is not received by FRS within 60 days of winning notification.
- Winners will be posted on the FRS Web site, www.frs.org, by May 1, 2019.
